

## Colon cancer screenings may offer peace of mind

When it comes to getting a colon cancer screening, some simple information can go a long way toward putting your mind at ease

## Did you know?



Screenings may help find precancerous growths called polyps. Your provider can help you decide if or when the polyps should be removed.



Regular screenings can help find cancer early when treatment may be easier and more effective.



Screenings, which are considered preventive care, are covered under your health plan.



**Options for colon cancer screening include at-home tests** Talk to your provider about the pros and cons of each option to determine which test is right for you<sup>1</sup>



# Make time to get a colon cancer screening

The American Cancer Society recommends completing one of these tests to screen for colon cancer.<sup>2</sup>

#### Fecal occult blood test at-home kit

Stool samples are collected at home and sent away to be analyzed for blood. Request an at-home kit by calling the number on the back of your member ID card.

Recommended once a year starting at age 50<sup>1</sup>

#### Flexible sigmoidoscopy

This screening is similar to the colonoscopy but checks only the lower third of the colon. This exam usually takes 10 to 20 minutes.

Recommended once every 5 years starting at age 50<sup>1</sup>

### 2 Cologuard<sup>®</sup> stool DNA test

A simple home-use kit used to collect stool samples. The samples are analyzed for altered DNA and/or blood in the stool. Your Primary Care Provider will need to write you a prescription to order a Cologuard<sup>®</sup> kit.

Recommended every 3 years starting at age 50<sup>1</sup>



#### Colonoscopy

This procedure lets doctors check the entire length of the colon using a thin, flexible tube fitted with a tiny camera. This exam usually takes about 30 minutes, and patients are usually given medicine to help them relax or sleep.

Recommended once every 10 years starting at age 50<sup>1</sup>
